The Four Waters of Prayer



Taken from the Autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila, beginning in Chapter 11.

For "those who are beginning to be servants of love."

(Vida 11:1)

- **First Water** is from a well and carried in a bucket to the garden- refers to beginners, using discursive prayer of meditation, w/ some fatigue and aridity
- Second Water in which the gardener secures water through use of a windlass and bucket;
 "prayef of quiet," a passive prayer, gift of God
- Third Water uses irrigation from stream or river; "sleep of the faculties." (closely related to "quiet"
- Fourth Water is God given: the rain;
 state of union in prayer in which the soul is apparently passive.
